BOARD OF DIRECTORS



The Board of Directors held their meeting on October 15, 2009.

The Board voted to approve the minutes of the September 17, 2009 meeting.

The Treasurer reported that the balances in the checking accounts as of September 30, 2008 were: Operating = \$7,900, Foundation = \$26,369 and Parking = \$10,798. At present 74 members have paid their dues. Second notices will be sent today and on November 1, 2009 suspension letters will be sent to those members who do not pay.
